Students were inspired by Father Rob's story. 7th grade student, Neve commented, "I enjoyed the speaker, Father Rob, because his life journey was very inspiring. I thought that he was the best, because his story really touched my heart. It made me think, do I make the right decisions? Am I listening to God?" Likewise, Christian speaker Brian Greensfield also made an impact on students with his story and call to faith. "I could feel God's presence when Brian was talking. He inspired me to pray," stated 7th grader, Connor.

The day wrapped up with a special Mass said by Cardinal Blase Joseph Cupich. Overall, it was a day students will not soon forget, filled with live music, dynamic speakers, praise experiences, and sacramental moments designed to deepen their faith. Another student, Anika, summed up her experience at Holy Fire by stating, "Holy Fire showed me that God didn't just send me here, he sent me here for a purpose.
